President Chavez commented on the bulletin board displays in the room done by Randall-Pepper Elementary School, and asked if all schools were implementing Professional Learning Communities. Mr. Dueñas provided information on district-wide implementation of PLCs; Ms. Chavez shared that she had been impressed at what she had seen. Ms. Chavez continued that she knew there were positions they needed to look at but also needed to be conservative with the District's money and be very careful; if the budget was looking good it was only because of cutting positions like they had to. She noted that she missed the Superintendent but did not want her back until she was perfectly healthy. Ms. Chavez commented that she had visited Poplar Elementary School over the concern of the teacher who spoke at the previous meeting about being in fear of going to work. Ms. Chavez spent the morning and afternoon at the school and found nothing; everyone was pleasant and happy. She stated that she didn't understand the problem and was still hoping for a forum for parents to come and speak without any staff from the school being there, and that the Principal seemed a little stressed because she was trying to please everyone. Mr. Alvarez noted that he was trying to schedule a forum in conjunction with a School Site Council or English Learners Advisory Council meeting.

Board Member Comments, continued

Mr. Hawthorn asked if it would be legal or permissible to send a blanket email to everybody in the District to vote for Jurupa Hills High School in the grant for education. Mr. Sawyer responded it would be okay because it was an educational matter.

President Chavez adjourned the meeting at 11:03 p.m.
